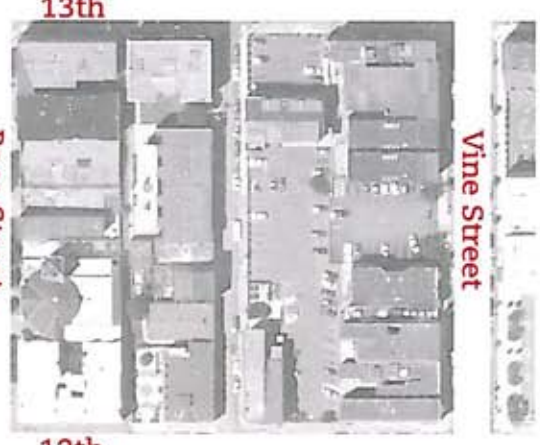
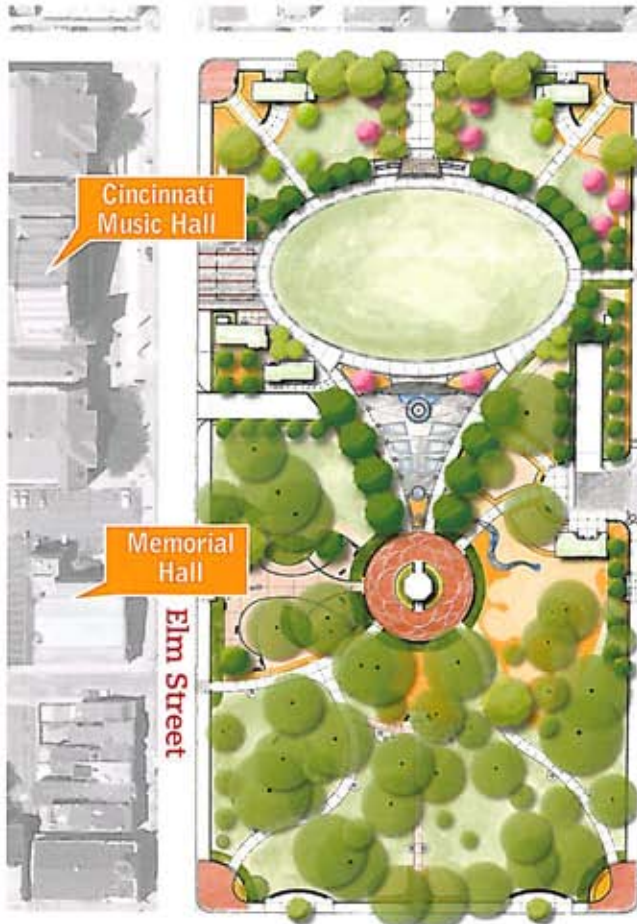

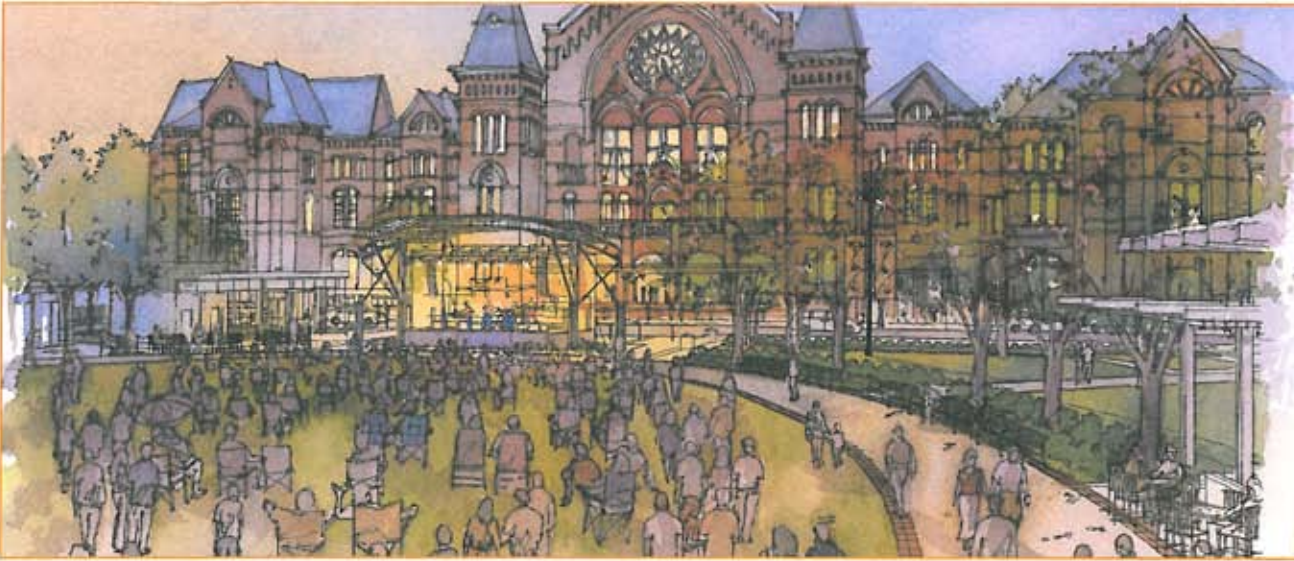
## WASHINGTON PARK FEATURES



**PERFORMANCE STAGE** – A 30' by 22' open-air performance stage at the north end of the civic green overlooks the entire park. This stage will be readily available with features such as a 'plug-and-play' tech center and an LED lighting system that can be used year-round. The stage can accommodate up to a 15-piece band. When not in use, this structure will create a shaded area for seating.



**CIVIC LAWN** – A 49,000 square foot expansive civic lawn, about the size of a football field, will be a venue for outdoor performances, events, and recreation. The lawn can comfortably hold more than 10,000 people for events and is surrounded by public benches in natural shade.



**EVENT PLAZA** – A new 6,200 square foot granite outdoor event plaza serving as Music Hall's front porch can support a large, temporary stage for performances and tent for special events.

**PLAZA STAGE** – A 40' by 40' temporary stage can be installed at the event plaza. It features an LED lighting system and professional sound equipment and can be installed anytime throughout the year. This stage has the unique backdrop of Music Hall and overlooks the civic lawn that can hold over 10,000 people.



**VIDEO SCREEN** – The video screen will be available to rent for permitted events. It will promote regional attractions, enhance Washington Park concerts and shows, inform visitors of local history and happenings, and play movies during special events.



**HISTORIC BANDSTAND** - This iconic historic bandstand was restored to its original stature and remains the centerpiece of Washington Park. Illuminated by tivolli lights, surrounded by benches and encircled by paving stones, this attraction has a romantic, European feel. The bandstand will have a 'plug-and-play' tech center for simple performances.



**INTERACTIVE WATER FEATURE** - A state-of-the-art, 7,000-square foot interactive water feature is a focal point for the park and a year-round attraction. The water feature consists of more than 130 pop up jets that can be synchronized to music and lights. Other elements include steps with cascading water and a large boulder with water flowing over the sides to create a playful attraction for children.



**PLAYGROUND** - The half-acre, fenced children's playground has features based on historic Cincinnati structures, created to symbolize the rich heritage of the Queen City. Features include a play castle, climbing wall, sandbox, dual slides, a canal boat in a stream, and musical instruments – all creatively integrated into a safe and imaginative play environment for children of all ages. The play area will be programmed with free activities for all families to enjoy.



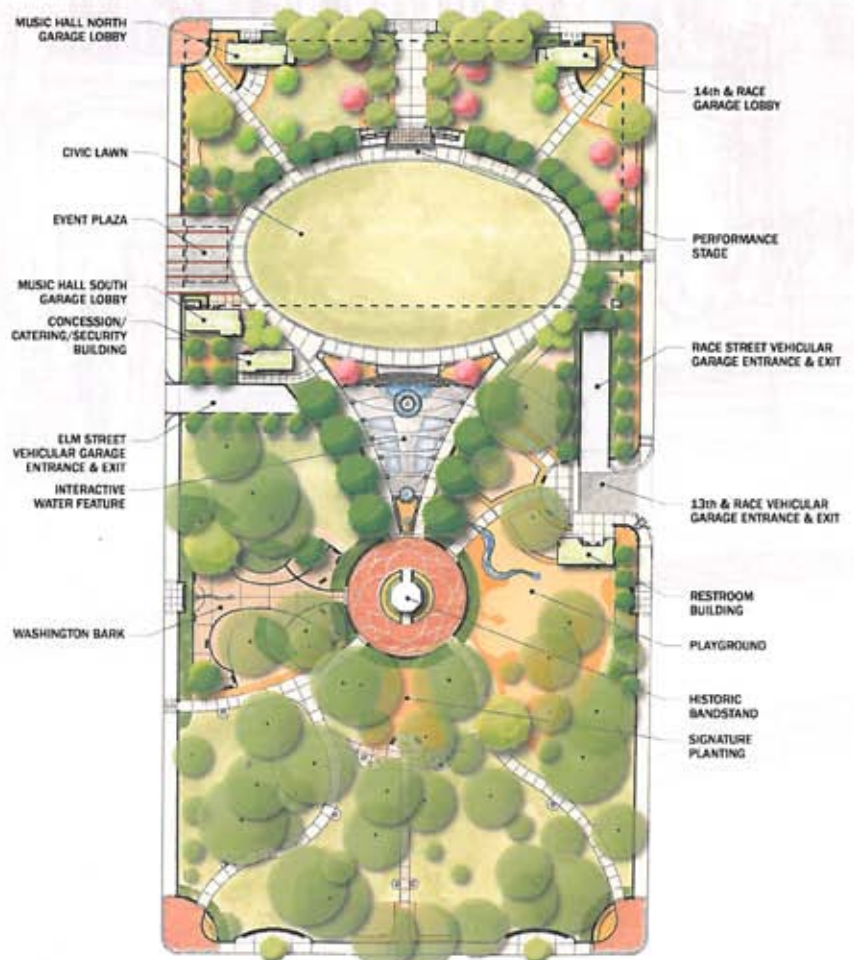


**WASHINGTON BARK** – The 12,000-square foot fenced dog park is the only one of its kind in Over-The-Rhine and the downtown area. It offers unique features for visitors and their pets, such as a water creek for the dogs to play in, large granite boulders, and a water fountain with fresh water for the pet owners and a spout close to the ground for dogs. Benches will line the perimeter so visitors can read a book, socialize with other patrons or just relax. It also features a special synthetic canine turf and pea gravel to maintain cleanliness. The park will be maintained by the Park Board, keeping it a desirable place for everyone.



## ADDITIONAL FEATURES

Washington Park will be served by a 450-space parking garage monitored 24/7, located underneath the civic lawn with two ramps. The park also includes seasonal landscaping maintained by the Cincinnati Park Board, distributed sound throughout the entire park, three secured garage lobbies, a concession stand, and a family-friendly public restroom.
